The 23rd academic year has been a time of expansion, development, changes and encouragement as the EST Educational Center continues to flourish and grow. As we come to the end of the second semester of classes at EST, please pray for students, faculty and administrative staff over the summer months as we seek to minister, rest and recruit students for the 2013-2014 academic year. Also, pray for faculty and staff as they preach, visit churches, Christian organizations and talk to individuals about the opportunities offered by EST.

Why study at Evangelical School of Theology in the B.A. program? 10 reasons

1. We are accredited by the Polish government. Our B.A. degree is honored by other colleges and universities and enables our graduates to enter various post-graduate programs.

2. Our students have full student rights. Student identification card issued by EST opens many doors and offers multiple student privileges from student discounts on city transportation to lower prices in cinemas or restaurants.

3. Very good location. EST is located in the center of Wroclaw, near the University of Wroclaw and close to the main Market Square and convenient by bus, tram or car from anywhere in Wroclaw.

4. The faculty. Our faculty is made up of highly qualified international lecturers representing various interdenominational backgrounds. They also serve as pastors, leaders and missionaries.

5. Interdenominational nature. The faculty, staff and students themselves represent various churches and denominations. Spending time together and studying the Bible and theology offers opportunities to understand each other better and to learn from each other.

6. Practical skills. EST emphasizes the practical aspect of learning by preparing the students for the real challenges that they are facing or will face in ministry.

7. Well-developed scholarship program. If needed, students can apply for scholarship funds to cover some of the costs: tuition, books, housing, etc.

8. Students can continue with their usual responsibilities while studying at EST.

The EST program is designed to allow students an opportunity to continue with their normal life as they come to EST for one weekend a month. Also, some courses are offered via e-learning.

9. The library. The EST library is a special place where students can find the necessary books as well as receive assistance in the selection of materials needed for papers or their thesis. There is also a special section of the library where EST students come to relax and enjoy a cup of tea.

10. Unique atmosphere. Warm relationships of the faculty and staff with the students include communal prayer, meetings over a meal, and individual approach to each student. This creates a unique and warm student-friendly atmosphere that is conducive to learning, making new friends and building true Christian fellowship.

Students and Why They Study at EST



Karol (Charles) – 3rd year. I have been married for 10 years and have one daughter and I work for the Fire Department. I am a member of the Council of Elders in a church in Glogow. I chose to study at EST for a number of reasons. The most important one is the interdenominational nature of the school and quality of teaching, which makes studying here an intellectual adventure. I like the good atmosphere that is created by the faculty and which is quickly detected and enjoyed by the students. What is also important is that EST offers assistance: financial through various scholarship programs and pastoral care. This is the first time in my life that I will be sorry to graduate from a school.



Cezary (Caesar) – 2nd year. My official ministry in the church started when I was 23 years old. In 1992, I was ordained to be deacon and evangelist and my wife and I were called to minister with an international evangelistic organization in Poland and several European countries. For the last three years I have been a pastor of a church in Klodzko. After two years of serving as a pastor I came to realize that my years of experience in ministry needed to be supplemented by theological knowledge and I chose to study at EST. I am able to continue with my ministry and study at EST for a number of reasons: evangelical nature of the school, high academic level, and financial support offered to students, incredibly friendly faculty and staff, etc. In my humble opinion, studying theology at such a modern and student friendly school like EST is a pure pleasure!



Katarzyna (Katherine) – 1st year. – Currently, I am the president of a foundation that focuses on Christian counseling as well as offering assistance through crisis intervention for women. I chose to study at EST because this school does not focus on the teaching of one denomination. What is more, the school offers a good scholarship program. Having a scholarship enabled my husband (Ryszard) and me to study at EST at the same time. I very much enjoy the fact that students come from various denominations and represent diverse views. I appreciate the friendly and easy relationships with the faculty. The systematic biblical knowledge that I have the opportunity to obtain here will help me in my teaching ministry.



Ryszard (Richard) – 1st year. My wife and I have two children. I am in full-time ministry and the pastor of a Baptist church in Bydgoszcz. Because I'm involved in missions I am certain that the knowledge and experience obtained at EST will help me as I meet the many challenges connected with my ministry.
